Artist of the Month Van Gogh (1853-1890)



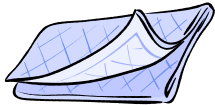

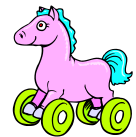
Reminder about Cubbies

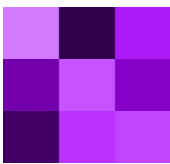


Blankets
